As per the references 1st and 2nd cited above, working instructions for the implementation of Keragramam (First year) have been issued. As per the reference 3rd cited, continuous administrative sanction for the scheme has been modified by including assistance for the sub component VI-Assistance for Panchayat Level Kera Samithies/ societies as detailed below.

VI. Assistance for Panchayat Level Kera Samithies (Societies)

An amount of Rs 75.00 lakh is earmarked to provide assistance to 15 no.s of Kera Samithies / Societies formed in each Keragramams at the rate of Rs 5.0 lakh per Kera Samithy / Society for their establishment, to take up and organize common activities on a group approach for cultural operations, application of manures and fertilizers, plant protection and other unforeseen expenses. Action plan /project for the group activities should be prepared by the concerned Agricultural Officers and implemented with the approval of block level Assistant Director of Agriculture. The expenditure for the registration of the new samithies, campaigns, trainings, meetings, survey and other related expenditure can also be met from this component. However purchase of computer and accessories, office furniture etc should not be met from this component. The amount will also be utilized for undertaking activities related to coconut husk procurement and working capital to establish a coir processing unit in the cluster @ Rs 2 lakh per kerasamithy/ society. The assistance can be extended to a group/ society or an SHG willing to under take this activity. This activity can be linked with the schemes of Coir Development Department and can avail the subsidy from that Department also. Any savings from this component can be utilized to organize activities on a group approach mentioned as per VI(a) or as a working capital for value addition and agro processsing unit mentioned in VI(b) below.

(b) Value addition and Agro processing are regarded as sunrise sector of Kerala Economy in view of its large potential for economic growth. Consequent on the declaration of 1193 Chingam 1

to 1194 Chingam1 as coconut year, Government of Kerala have announced to support value addition projects giving thrust to coconut. Small Farmers Agri Business Consortium (SFAC) has been identified as the implementing agency of the scheme. To take up common activities like value addition, agro processing units(virgin coconut oil, coconut milk cream, coconut palm jaggery, shell charcoal, shell powder, vinegar, handi crafts etc) and its marketing, an amount of Rs 1500 lakh @Rs 25 lakh per Keragramam will be provided as project based back ended subsidy by SFAC subjet to the conditions and guidelines laid down by SFAC. Viable projects by clusters, SHGs, NGOs, Partnership firms, FPOs and individual entrepreneurs availing loan from any nationalized/ scheduled/ cooperative/ regional rural banks/ other non banking financial institutions will be considered under this scheme.

As per the Direction of the Government, the norms for extending support to micro, small, medium coconut based enterprises under this scheme will be based on the following broad guide lines of the Entrepreneur Support Scheme (ESS) of Industries Department.

- 1. An assistance of 15 % limited to Rs 2.00 lakh will be payable on the fixed capital investment of all micro, small and medium enterprises.
- 2. All micro, small and medium enterprises established by entrepreneurs belonging to Women, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and Young entrepreneurs (between the age of 18 and 45 years) shall be eligible for an assistance of 20 % of the fixed capital investment.
- 3. Since Agro based and food processing industries have been declared under **priority** industries, this sector shall be eligible for an additional assistance of 10 % of the fixed capital investment.
- 4. In the case of all micro, small and medium enterprises set up in the districts of Idukki, Wayanadu, Kasaragode and Pathanamthitta there will be an additional assistance of 10 % of the fixed capital investment.
- 5. In the case of micro, small and medium industrial units set up after acquiring **new technology** from approved research institutions, recognized as such by State or Central Government, there shall be an additional assistance of 10 % of the fixed capital investment.

However total assistance for an enterprise shall not exceed Rs 2.0 lakh.

The principal elements of Fixed Capital Investment such as land, land development costs, building, essential office infrastructure, plant and machinery, electrification costs, testing equipment, generator, other energy generating equipment, pollution control equipment and investments on recycling of water, waste and rain water harvesting if utilized for industrial purpose shall be

admitted for assistance. The Assistant Director of Agriculture shall be competent to declare a component essential to the unit on a case by case based on the project submitted to the Assistant Director of Agriculture for approval.

Assistance to any unit which has already received any subsidy or grant earlier under other schemes, from other Government agencies, any state owned financial institution shall be limited to the balance remaining eligible assistance payable under the Keragramam scheme.
